Director's Notes

As director of *Arsenic and Old Lace* I welcome you to our latest production and I do hope you enjoy my take on this classic show.

When I was younger I used to sit and watch the old Cary Grant movies with my parents and always delighted in *Arsenic and Old Lace*. As an adult I now consider how and when it was written. Its message is dark but humorously delivered. It speaks of things that are still not easy to talk about - the old ladies considered poisoning lonely old men with no family to be a mercy (euthanasia); and they are dealing with mental health (Teddy is either crazy or has a personality disorder).

Back in the 1940s people would humour those with mental health issues (if they were not dangerous) or institutionalise them (if they were). Those two views would be confronting enough, but then we meet a serial killer who moves around the world killing people, accompanied by a plastic surgeon who conceals his identity. This was not a commonplace concept. All these elements combine to create a quite dark comedy.

There is also the subtle but obvious element of racism from an early pre-globalism of an emerging World War II era.

This a family-centric show which talks of five generations of Brewsters and I am pleased to be able to represent my own family on the walls with images of my great grandparents and one of their sons (my great uncle). This family connection continues because my son also appears on stage with me.

This show has been in the planning for almost two years. It has taken the efforts of many people doing many hours of work to bring this to you. Our cast and crew listed on this program have worked together to present what we hope is an entertaining show for you.


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
