Director Steve Ryan and it won't be his last.




Ross


The Ross character in *Strictly Murder* has been one of his more challenging roles.

The Playwright

The playwright, Brian Clemens, was a British screenwriter and television producer, possibly best known to audiences for his work on television's *The Avengers* and *The Professionals* series. In addition to his prolific and successful television career, Clemens had a long connection with the theatre, starting with a stage play of *The Avengers* in 1971. He later penned 15 more plays, ranging from comedies to thrillers, including *Strictly Murder*, in 2006.

About the Play

April 1939. An English couple, Peter and Suzy, are living in Provence in idyllic isolation. Far, it seems, from the rumblings of the coming war. When Scotland Yard detectives arrive their peace is shattered from within when Suzy discovers she has been betrayed: Peter is not the man he claims to be. Suzy's life is thrown into turmoil as the possibility arises that Peter may in fact be a ruthless killer on the run.

In a world where the Third Reich is emerging as a dangerous regime, deceit, lies and subterfuge make this fast paced thriller a dark and nail-biting rollercoaster.

Setting

The action of the play takes place in a rustic cottage in a valley in Provence, France in 1939.

Run Time

The play runs for approximately 2 hours including a 15 minute interval.

Director's Notes

Strictly Murder is a thrilling, entertaining piece of theatre that's not a whodunit, but rather a "what's going on here?" This is because it seems that all the cards are laid out on the table for the audience to see, but suddenly, you're presented with an unexpected plot change and are left to wonder how the story will play out.

Set against the imminent war in Europe, *Strictly Murder* is also a chilling reminder of the impact of war.

I have enjoyed seeing this play take shape over the last three months — a thriller written by an expert script writer who wrote many of the television shows that we grew up watching.

I'd like to thank everyone involved in helping to produce *Strictly Murder*, but particularly Col Kirkman (and her family), Dimity Eveleens, Anne and Ian Robinson.

From the Script

The following are English translations of the German radio announcements heard during the early part of the play:

Act 1 Scene 1 opening:

"Chancellor Hitler again promised independence for Slovakia, and discounted that he had any claims to the territory. He asserted again that his only aims were for peace in Europe, but at the same time made it clear that the Reichsland and the rights of the Fatherland were, and would remain, his prime concern.

On the Home Front - the weather today is expected to be ..."

Act 1 Scene 1 close:

"Last night the Fuhrer addressed a crowd of more than fifty thousand loyal Germans, to put forward his dream of a better Reichsland ..."
