The True Story of the Calendar Girls

Calendar Girls is based on the remarkable true story of a group of women from a branch of the Women's Institute in Yorkshire who transcended ordinary life to achieve something extraordinary.

The Women's Institute, known for its typical activities like baking and knitting, was the setting for an unprecedented idea following the death of John Baker. John, the husband of WI member Angela Baker, succumbed to non-Hodgkin's lymphoma in 1998. Seeking to memorialise him and contribute to the fight against cancer, Angela and her friends embarked on a unique fundraising venture.

The idea was to raise money for Leukaemia Research, now known as Blood Cancer UK. Breaking away from the conventional image of middle-aged WI members, the calendar unexpectedly garnered international fame. The women's boldness, sense of humour, and dedication struck a chord worldwide. Not only did the calendar raise significant funds for leukemia research, but it also challenged stereotypes about age, beauty, and propriety.

Calendar Girls celebrates the extraordinary impact a group of ordinary women can have, turning a personal loss into a legacy of hope and change. Their story is an inspiring testament to the power of friendship, determination, and the human spirit's capacity to make a difference.
